Dear Mr. Hodai,

We are writing to you as representatives of Prof. Dr. Kocho Angjushev before all Departments and Agencies of the United States Government.

It has come to our attention that your organization has unjustifiably and inappropriately linked Mr. Angjushev's name to your projects, thereby causing undue harm to his reputation. Your attempt to associate him with alleged corruption in education is both baseless and misleading given that the visa restriction in question has no connection to his academic work as a professor. Indeed, this restriction, which we believe is politically motivated, is not based on any legitimate grounds. It is currently under review by the appropriate authorities in Washington and we expect the restriction imposed on him to be lifted. We maintain a close working relationship with the world's largest law firm, Dentons, in relation to such matters.

Prof. Dr. Kocho Angjushev is a highly respected expert and professor at the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering at the state university in Skopje. He has maintained an impeccable academic record, having completed his doctoral studies in Germany and served as a visiting professor in the United Kingdom, and is one of the few professors who has successfully applied science in practice, creating more than 1,000 jobs in the country. His contributions to education and industry are widely recognized, making any attempt to misrepresent his reputation entirely unwarranted.

Given the above, we formally demand that you immediately cease any further misuse of Mr. Angjushev's name in your activities.

Should such actions persist, we, as his legal representatives, will escalate this matter to the relevant institutions in both the United States and North Macedonia. This includes formally notifying authorities about the misuse of U.S.-funded NGO activities in North Macedonia. Furthermore, we will take into account the commitment of the North Macedonian government to align with U.S. policies, as well as recent statements and actions by the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) concerning the reassessment of funding for foreign NGOs, including your organization.
